## Frequently Asked Questions – Targeted Community Organisations

### 1. Program details

#### 1.1. Key Dates

1 November 2024	Applications Open
28 February 2025, 5pm	Applications close
30 May 2025	Acquittal due

#### 1.2. What is available for each grant?

- \$1,000 for each building/facility used for sporting or community purposes to assist with the purchase of an AED.
- One grant is available per address. Facilities with multiple buildings in close proximity at the same address are eligible for a single grant only.

#### 1.3. What AED can I purchase with the Grant funds?

AEDs purchased with grant funds must be:

- Therapeutic Goods Administration Australia (TGA) approved with ARTG registration
- multi-use (consistent with [ANZCOR Guideline 11.2 Protocols for Adult Advanced Life Support, 2.4 Energy levels](#))
- operate in accordance with current [Australian Resuscitation Council](#) Guidelines.

#### 1.4. Will all applications receive a grant?

- All applications will be assessed by a panel.
- Organisations are encouraged to apply for all eligible buildings. For example, with 8 eligible buildings, you could potentially secure a grant of \$8,000.

## 2. Eligibility and applications

### 2.1. Which organisations are eligible?

Organisations eligible in this funding round are targeted Aboriginal and Community Organisations invited to apply by Preventive Health SA. The organisation must:

- be located in South Australia
- be a not-for-profit club, association or organisation that is sport or community related
- have an active Australian Business Number (ABN)
- have public liability insurance with a minimum of \$1 million per claim. Proof of eligibility will be required by uploading a Certificate of Currency.

Organisations must be one of the following:

- An Aboriginal community – a community predominantly populated by Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islanders.
- An Aboriginal Community Controlled Organisation [as per the [Corporations \(Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander\) Act 2006](#) and/or [6. Priority Reform Two – Building the Community-controlled Sector | Closing the Gap.](#)]
- An organisation that offers Aboriginal specific programs or one predominantly used by Aboriginal people for community or sporting related activities.
- A community service organisation– established for community service purposes eg Lions or Scouts, which has multiple buildings/facilities requiring an AED.

### 2.2. Which buildings are eligible?

Eligible buildings/facilities must:

- be predominantly used for community and/or sporting purposes in South Australia
- have a unique address or be located some distance apart. Facilities with multiple buildings in close proximity are eligible for one grant only.

Examples of eligible buildings/facilities that are used for community and/or sporting purposes include:

- organisations with playing fields, club rooms or a building
- community group buildings or halls
- camping sites with a building onsite.

## 2.3. Which buildings are ineligible?

Ineligible buildings include:

- those leased by commercial entities
- those used for educational purposes e.g. kindergartens and schools
- those used for health purposes e.g. clinics, aged care etc.
- permanent residential facilities.

## 2.4. What is considered a community or sporting organisation?

Sporting organisations are not-for-profit societies, associations or clubs supporting a game, sport or animal racing. See [here](#) for more information.

A community service organisation is a not-for-profit society, association or club established for community purposes except political or lobbying purposes. See [here](#) for more information.

## 2.5. What are the next steps?

To apply, visit [AED Grants Program – Targeted Community Organisations](#).

Successful organisations will enter into a Grant Agreement with Preventive Health SA to purchase and install an AED at each approved location.

At the completion of the grant period, the funded organisation will provide a Grant Acquittal Form demonstrating the grant funding was used to purchase a TGA approved, multi-use AED that operates in accordance with current Australian Resuscitation Council Guidelines.
